



I nelementary school, I moved with my family to Georgia. I wasn't in the Midwest where tornadoes are plentiful, but I remember tornado drills. We would go to the concrete wall at school, making sure we kept away from windows. We would kneel against the wall,

duck our heads under, and cover our necks. Tornadoes didn't strike very often, but that didn't matter. We heard enough precautions about tornadoes that at seven-years-old I was sure that the winds were going to come. Anytime the wind howled as I walked home from the neighborhood bus stop, I was scared. I would look up to see if the sky was green. And when I was 9 or 10, a small tornado touched down a few blocks from our neighborhood; the storm brought hail and lots of downed branches.


Che wind that I experienced and feared as a child was similar to the wind of the Holy Spirit that the disciples experienced on Pentecost.

That Sunday the Holy Spirit came, not like a peaceful dove or as a gentle breeze, but as singeing tongues of fire. The Spirit blew through the house as a strong and howling wind to drive the disciples out to streets to proclaim the gospel and share the love of Christ. Because of the Spirit, the disciples had to go out among people that they might not have known how to talk to under ordinary circumstances. They had to leave the safety of that room and go.

Chat's the Spirit we have. A Spirit who inspired the people and drove them to start the church. A Spirit who remained with them and continues to remain with us, pushing us in new directions, toward our call to something different or something we don't feel ready for. The Spirit has been described as one who comes

Facilities Management Update

The Facilities Management Committee and The Saturday Stewards held their

quarterly committee meeting on April 6, and discussed the following:

- 3 Bids for resurfacing entrances Both entrances have needed resurfacing for several years.
- 3 Bids for tinting Sanctuary windows - The first step before any flooring material can be installed, to prevent further fading of carpet, cushions, hymnals and Bibles.
- Solution 3 Bids for electrical work on new kitchen for Child Care Center
- Solution States Stat kitchen for Child Care Center
- 3 Prices on Electric Stove/Oven
 for new Kitchen at Child Care **Center** - One of our goals for this

year is to move the Child Care Center kitchen to a vacant room next to the



director's office. Our overall goal is to better secure the space where all their activities are conducted.

What to do with the recentlycleaned hill on the East Side of the property - We need to mark all discharge pipes and place riprap down the hill from the drains to prevent erosion. We discussed different ways to maintain the hillside, e.g., planting wildflowers, over seed with grass, etc. We will consult with Judi White and professionals before proceeding.

- May 25 will be Window Washing Day church-wide - We will seek help from the congregation so we can finish this task in Uhurch one day.
- + June 29 will be Deepclean the Kitchen Day, and cleaning floors in Stevenson Hall
 - Saturday Stewards will assist the Deacons, headed up by Joyce Boso and Barbara Lucas.
- Replacing lights in hallways and offices with 6" LED lights - The Committee agrees we need to start on this right away. With the rising cost of fluorescent bulbs, the frequency with which they are burning out, and the energy savings of LED lights, it would be costsaving for the church.We will discuss funding assistance with the Finance Committee, looking for assistance from the congregation, and checking on grants available.

LIFT UP THE WORD -LIGHT UP THE WORLD

A flower frog sits atop a vase to help arrange flowers and hold stems in place. This personalized frog will become a favorite!

What you need: • Air-dry clay Roller Vase (or jar) Plastic knife Straw Acrylic paint and brushes



- What you do: 1. Roll out a portion of clay to about ½-inch thickness.
- 2. Cut out a circle that's slightly larger than the vase opening. (This will allow the finished frog to sit securely on top.) 3. To make holes for stems, use a straw to punch out circle shapes. If
- you make more than one frog, try arranging the holes in different patterns
- 4. Let dry completely. Then personalize your work with acrylic paint.
- 5. When dry, place the frog atop the vase Arrange flowers and greenery to make a Mother's Day bouquet.
